

Senior Dog Vet Visit Checklist

Here are few things to help you prepare for your senior dog's next vet visit. Make sure to ask your vet about their best recommendation based on your senior dog's needs.



Things to do ahead of time:

- Fill out any forms and email them back ahead of time.
- Write a list of questions for your vet to bring with you.
- Take short 10-15 second video clips of your dog doing things you want to ask about.



Special Note:

- Pets can become more anxious as they get older. Don't be scared of pre-visit "chill pills" to help them be more relaxed during the visit. If recommended by your vet. Give as directed and keep in mind timing matters.



Things to bring with you:

- Bring your own yoga mat. (Optional - We have them too, but if you have one you really like, bring it with you!)
- Bring treats that are pre-approved for your dog to get during the visit. Especially if your dog is on a specific diet or has restrictions on what they can and can't have.



Bonus Tip!

- Bring a first morning urine sample (and a fresh stool sample) to the appointment. If not needed, we can discard it for you.
- If getting bloodwork, ask if your pet should be fasted.
